Overview

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 as an additional grant for pupils registered (now or in the previous six years) as eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) or LAC (a Looked After Child) or a child whose parents serve in the armed forces. It is additional to the main school funding and should be used to address any underlying inequalities.

Objectives for Pupil Premium at St Anne's:

- * In-line with our Mission Statement (above) allocation of PP Funding will reflect our Christian Values.
- * PP will be used to provide additional educational support to improve progress and raise standards for identified pupils.
- * PP will be used to narrow and close the gap between the achievement of these pupils and their peers.
- * PP will be used to address any underlying inequalities.
- * We will ensure that the additional funding reaches the pupils who need it and that it impacts on their education and lives.

Statistics:

- * Our school has 94 children (82 FSM) entitled to benefit from the additional funding.
- * The school received £1320 per FSM pupil and additional funds for LAC & Service children.
- * Therefore, the school received £ 124,640 Pupil Premium Funding.

Additional Funding from the school's delegated budget is added to the Pupil Premium to ensure that all children are nurtured, encouraged and celebrated.

In 2015, 100% of pupils made the expected progress from KS1 to KS2 – in every subject.

Of the 16 PP pupils in Y6, 15 achieved L4 in Reading, 14 in Maths and 13 in Writing.
