When was Britain conquered by the Romans?</p> <p>Local links Coin showing the bust of Emperor Claudius II, found in Rainford, St Helens.</p> <p>Three single Roman coins were found at Rainhill, (Sankey Brook at Parr and Ashton cotton mill)</p>	 <p>Conflict</p>	<p><u>Knowledge</u></p> <p>-The Emperor Hadrian built a great wall in the North East of England to separate Roman Britain from Scotland.</p> <p>-The Roman army first tried to invade Britain in 55 and 54 BC. this army was led by the famous military commander Julius Caesar.</p> <p>-On March 15, 44 BC, Julius Caesar was assassinated in Rome, Italy.</p> <p>-One of the most famous rebellions of this time was led by Queen Boudicca, the leader of the Iceni tribe.</p> <p>-In 43AD Aulus Plautius successfully invaded Britain.</p> <p><u>Tasks</u></p> <p>-Describe what is meant by the word 'territory'.</p>	<p><u>Knowledge</u></p> <p>- 410AD Romans left Britain because the armies were needed to defend other parts of the Empire.</p> <p><u>Tasks</u></p> <p>-Compare and contrast the invasions of Britain in 55 BC and 54 BC with the invasion of 43AD</p> <p>Suggested tasks</p> <p>- Organise information about the Punic Wars.</p>	<p><u>Knowledge</u></p> <p>Boudicca was a Celtic Queen who led a rebellion against the Roman occupation of Britain. Although her campaign was initially successful, her forces were defeated at the Battle of Watling Street in 61 AD.</p> <p><u>Tasks</u></p> <p>-Find out how it was possible for only 1,200 Roman soldiers to beat almost 80,000 Iceni tribespeople. What observations can you make about accounts from the battle?</p> <p>-Investigate the life of Queen Boudicca.</p>
